

Dear Fowlerville Families:

As we respond to the changing directives and guidance put out by state and federal government to minimize the potential effects of the Coronavirus, the Fowlerville Community Schools recognize the challenges that many of our families face. With work hours being limited in many sectors, child-care expenses while school is out, and the reduction of available groceries in many stores, we know many of our families are being affected. To assist in relieving the strain, we are partnering with Gleaners' Community Food Bank to distribute food to all of our students' families.

On Thursday, March 19th, and Thursday, April 2nd, a small group of volunteers will be handing out food at the high school. Any member of a student's family can come to the main entrance of the high school (straight in front of the drive near the LED sign on Grand Avenue just south of Sharp Road) between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m. Approximately two weeks of food for each student will be distributed to the family member.
