- A. Discussion of LESA Election – Superintendent Stuard
- B. Recommendation to Adopt Resolution Designating LESA Election Representative – Two seats on the LESA Board of Education will expire on June 30, 2023. Two candidates have filed to run for the open seats, they are: incumbent Ms. LuAnn Loy and incumbent Mr. Don Cortez; the terms are for six years. The Fowlerville Board of Education needs to designate a representative for the electoral body and an alternate representative in the event the designated representative is unable to attend, this election will take place Monday, June 5, 2023 at the LESA Education Center at 6:00 p.m. The Board will also decide who they will be voting for.

Recommendation: Administration recommends the Resolution designating a District LESA Election Representative, Alternate, and candidate be adopted as presented. The election will take place Monday, June 5, 2023 at the LESA Education Center at 6:00 p.m. [Appendix A] Roll Call Vote Needed.

- C. Recommendation to Adopt Final 2022-2023 General Fund Amendment

Recommendation: Administration, with unanimous support from the Finance Committee, recommends adopting the Final General Fund Appropriation Budget for 2022-2023 with revenues totaling \$34,967,718 and expenditures totaling \$35,341,887. As of June 30, 2023, the projected fund balance is \$3,148,296, as presented. [Appendix B] Roll Call Vote Needed.

- D. Recommendation to Adopt Final 2022-2023 Community Services Fund

Recommendation: Administration, with unanimous support from the Finance Committee, recommends adoption of the Final Community Services Fund for 2022-2023 with revenues totaling \$1,376,524 and expenditures totaling \$1,376,524. As of June 30, 2023, projected fund balance is \$396,399, as presented [Appendix C]. Roll Call Vote Needed.

- E. Recommendation to Authorize Superintendent Stuard Additional \$60,045 in Change Orders

Recommendation: Administration, with unanimous support from the Bond Projects Committee, recommends the approval of Change Request #06 to include an additional \$60,045 for Building Pad Undercut as part of the 2021 Bond Issue for the K-2 building project. [Appendix D] Roll Call Vote Needed.

- F. Recommendation to Approve Fiber Optic Rerouting from the 2021 Bond Issue







Good Evening Board Members,

To accommodate the new construction project to keep Natalie Kreeger Elementary connected and provide easy access to connect the new building we are proposing the following work be performed by our Fiber Maintenance Agreement partner Amcomm Telecommunications Inc.

As part of this project Amcomm Telecomm will be performing Directional Boring underneath the existing bus lot and installing a new HandHold outside of the current fiber entrance into Natalie Kreeger Elementary. This HandHold will also serve as the tap in point for the new building. The proposed route is attached and has been approved by the Auch Construction Team as viable and unobtrusive to their proposed layouts. The conduit will be a 4 inch conduit allowing for ample expansion to include the new buildings fiber strands. 12-strand single mode fiber will be run and spliced into the new external-internal Fiber enclosure.

The total cost of this project is estimated at \$37,751.80 (Quotes are attached). As this project falls under the umbrella of our previously bid Fiber Maintenance Agreement we do not have to go out for bid and will be reimbursed 50% of the cost of the project once E-Rate approved.

It is my recommendation that we move forward with this project.



**Between the Fowlerville Education Support Personnel Association MEA-NEA Transportation Bargaining Unit
and the Fowlerville Community Schools Board of Education**

This Letter of Agreement is entered into this 16th day of May 2023, by and between Fowlerville Community Schools referred to as the "School District" and the Fowlerville ESP Transportation Association, MEA-NEA, referred to as the "Association." In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the School District and the Association hereby agree to the following:

1. The District will provide a \$600 per month contribution to District Medical Insurance plans for Full Time Drivers.
2. The District will provide a \$300 per month cash in lieu for each employee opting out of coverage.
3. Medical coverage or cash in lieu effective June 1, 2023.

This Letter of Agreement shall become effective immediately upon ratification by both parties. This Letter of Agreement will expire on June 30, 2025, and terms will be added to the new contract in Article XII. The School District and the Association also agree that this Letter of Agreement shall not be deemed a precedent or past practice for purposes of the labor relations between the parties.
