Dear Counselor:

The office of Federal Student Aid, U.S. Department of Education, would like to share some updates to assist you in working with students.

## Changes to the FAFSA® for the 2017–18 Application Cycle

The 2017–18 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) season began earlier than previous FAFSA application cycles. Since Oct. 1, 2016, students have been able to fill out the FAFSA for the 2017–18 school year. (In the past, the FAFSA didn't launch until Jan. 1). In addition, applicants no longer need to estimate income and tax information and have been able to retrieve their data directly from the IRS right from the day the FAFSA launched. Students also now have information about their Expected Family Contributions earlier, helping them as they're going through the college application and selection process.

site so we can communicate with you more effectively. You also can change your postal address or other contact information at that site.

## Paper FAFSA® Forms Discontinued Starting in 2017-18

Starting with the 2017–18 award year, the preprinted FAFSA® is no longer available. The preprinted FAFSA is the booklet version of the FAFSA. The PDF FAFSA is still available for download across multiple Federal Student Aid websites (e.g., fafsa.gov,

StudentAid.gov/resources, and FinancialAidToolkit.ed.gov/resources). Students without internet access can obtain print-outs of the PDF FAFSA from edpubs.gov or from 1-877-4-ED-PUBS (1-877-433-7827). Students may request up to five copies of the PDF FAFSA print-out and should receive the copies in three to seven business days after ordering.
